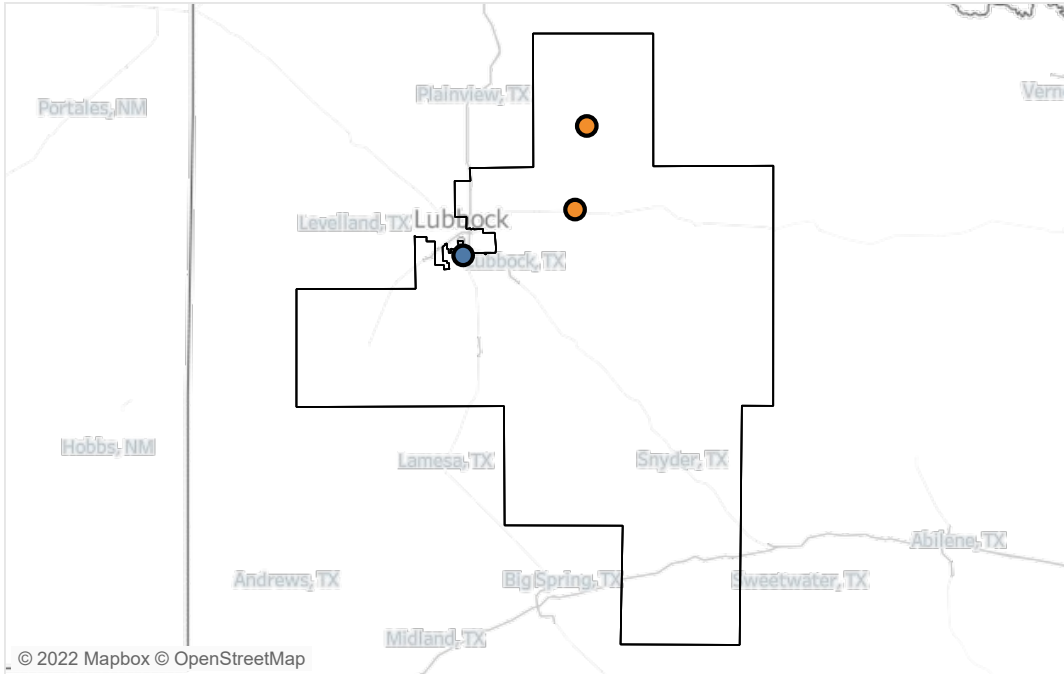


## Health Centers in TX HD83 - Rep. Dustin Burrows

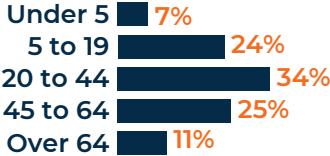

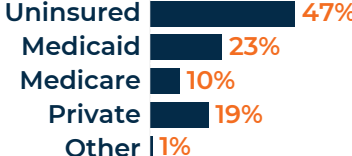
