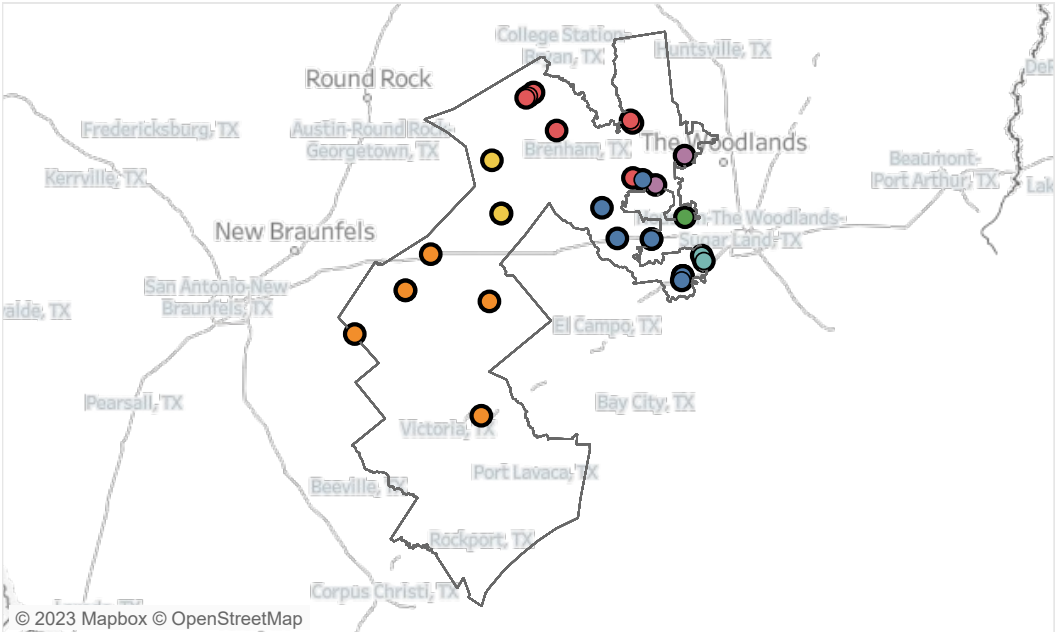


## Health Centers in TX SD18 - Sen. Lois Kolkhorst

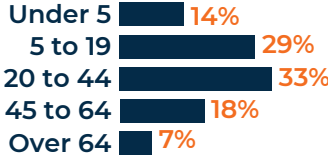

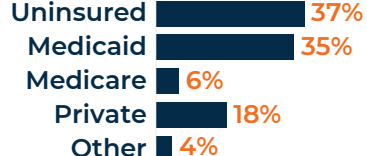
